

BATTLE OF SERINGAPATUM, INDIA 1799

The Siege of Seringapatam (5th April – 4th May 1799) was the final confrontation of the Fourth Anglo-Mysore War between the British East India Company and the Kingdom of Mysore.

The British achieved a decisive victory after breaching the walls of the fortress at Seringapatam and storming the citadel. Tipu Sultan, Mysore's ruler, was killed in the action.

The British restored the Wodeyar dynasty to the throne after the victory, but retained indirect control of the kingdom.
