CHITRAL EXPEDITION INDIA 1895

The Chitral Expedition was a military expedition in 1895 sent by the British authorities to relieve the fort at Chitral in northwest India which was under siege after a local coup after the death of the old ruler power changed hands several times.

An intervening British force of about 400 men was besieged in the fort until it was relieved by two expeditions, a small one from Gilgit and a large one from Peshawar.
